

EXHIBIT 1386-G GROWER / GROVE MANAGER OF MANDARINS WITH ATTACHED STEMS AND LEAVES

PROVISIONS FOR THE INTRASTATE SHIPMENT OF MANDARINS WITH ATTACHED STEMS AND LEAVES FROM OR WITHIN THE ASIAN CITRUS PSYLLID STATE INTERIOR QUARANTINE AREA

To Be Used in Conjunction with Master Permit QC1386

Establishment agrees to the following:

1. Mandarin Fruit with Attached Stems and Leaves

Under the California Code of Regulations, Section 3435 and the Federal Domestic Quarantine 301.76 for Citrus Greening and Asian Citrus Psyllid, citrus fruit in bulk containers or bins and citrus fruit with stems and leaves attached are considered hosts or possible carriers of Asian citrus psyllid (ACP) and must not move within or leave the ACP quarantine area(s) unless complying with all of the following:

2. Eligible Mandarins with Attached Stems and Leaves

Mandarins with attached stems and leaves must be grown in an area quarantined only for ACP and not in an area quarantined for Huanglongbing (HLB) or regulated for Sweet Orange Scab (SOS).

3. Harvesting Equipment

Harvesting equipment (including containers, barrels, bins, etc.) used for harvesting and transporting/hauling mandarin fruit with attached stem and leaves must be free from all debris, which may harbor ACP, prior to leaving the ACP quarantine area.

4. Transporting Citrus Fruit to a Receiver

If receiver is located within the same ACP quarantine area, operate under (4)(a). If the receiver is located outside of the ACP quarantine area or is located within a separate non-contiguous ACP quarantine area, (4)(b) and either (4)(c) or (4)(d) must be completed prior to movement:

a. Citrus Fruit Grown and Packed Within The Same Quarantine Area

Citrus fruit grown and packed within the same quarantine area may move from the grower to the packer/processor if contained in a fully enclosed vehicle or completely covered by a tarp.

b. ACP-Free Declaration Form

All loads must be transported in a fully enclosed vehicle or completely covered by a tarp. For each citrus grove to be harvested, complete and submit the "ACP-Free Declaration" form to the local County Agricultural Commissioner at least 72 hours in advance of choosing the method to ensure the shipment is free of ACP. c. QC Permit 1386 - Field Cleaned Citrus Option: Fruit must be field cleaned and all of the following must be completed.

- i. Notify the County Agricultural Commissioner of the receiving county at least 24 hours prior to transport of any shipment. Notification shall include all of the following information:
 - Receiver: name and complete physical destination address
 - Date of shipment(s) and estimated date/time of arrival
 - Weight or amount of shipment(s) (# of trucks, bins of fruit, etc.)
- ii. Each shipment must be accompanied by an "ACP-Free Declaration" form.

- d. **QC Permit 1386 – “Spray and Harvest” Citrus Option:** Fruit may be transported under the spray and harvest option if all of the following are completed.
- i. Notify the County Agricultural Commissioner of the receiving county at least 24 hours prior to transport of any shipment. Notification shall include all of the following information:
 - Receiver: name and complete physical destination address
 - Date of shipment(s) and estimated date/time of arrival
 - Weight or amount of shipment(s) (# of trucks, bins of fruit, etc.)
 - ii. Grove must be treated prior to harvest with an ACP Program Approved foliar product effective against psyllids. <http://phpps.cdfa.ca.gov/PE/InteriorExclusion/pdf/acpgrowerinformation.pdf>
 - iii. Each shipment must be accompanied by an “ACP-Free Declaration” form.

5. Establishments Under Compliance

- a. Ensure the fruit is transported/hailed by transporters/haulers under compliance with the ACP Program.
- b. Mandarin fruit must be transported in a fully enclosed vehicle or be completely covered by tarp, regardless of origin or destination.
- c. Ensure fruit is delivered to and handled by packers/processors under compliance with the ACP Program. The packer/processor may be located within or outside of an area quarantined for ACP.

6. Green Waste Disposal

All green waste, including leaf and stem debris, must be disposed of in accordance with the ACP Program, local County Agricultural Commissioner, under QC Master Permit 1289 or other ACP Program approved manner.

7. Trapping and Inspection

Allow agricultural officials to inspect the premises to ensure compliance with this agreement, obtain and review records of all shipments destined to locations outside the ACP quarantine area, and place and service traps for the detection of ACP.

8. Records

Maintain records of all ACP host shipments to processors/packinghouses leaving the quarantine area, and provide records to agriculture inspectors immediately upon request.

9. Training

Ensure all employees receive training to be compliant with all specifications of this compliance agreement exhibit.
