

## EXHIBIT 1386-T TRANSPORTER/HAULER OF MANDARINS WITH STEMS AND LEAVES

### PROVISIONS FOR THE INTRASTATE SHIPMENT OF MANDARINS WITH ATTACHED STEMS AND LEAVES FROM OR WITHIN THE ASIAN CITRUS PSYLLID STATE INTERIOR QUARANTINE AREA

To Be Used in Conjunction with Master Permit QC 1386

#### Establishment Agrees to the Following

##### 1. Mandarin Fruit with Attached Stems and Leaves

Under the California Code of Regulations, Section 3435 and the Federal Domestic Quarantine 301.76 for Citrus Greening and Asian Citrus Psyllid, citrus fruit in bulk containers or bins and citrus fruit with stems and leaves attached are considered hosts or possible carriers of Asian citrus psyllid (ACP) and must not move within or leave the ACP quarantine area(s) unless complying with all of the following:

##### 2. Transporter Requirements

Transporters/haulers must operate under a compliance agreement with the ACP Program that stipulates:

- Mandarins with stems and leaves must not originate or be processed in an area quarantined for Huanglongbing (HLB) or regulated for sweet orange scab (SOS); and
- The fruit must not be comingled with fruit that has been in an area quarantined for HLB or regulated for SOS; and
- Mandarins with attached stems and leaves must be transported within a completely enclosed vehicle or be completely covered with tarp or mesh with holes no larger than approximately 0.3 square millimeters (0.547mm x 0.547mm or 0.6mm x 0.5mm) in size.

##### 3. Establishments Under Compliance

- Ensure that mandarin fruit with attached stems and leaves being transported is produced by a grower/grove manager under compliance with the ACP Program.
- Ensure fruit is delivered to and handled by packers/processors under compliance with the ACP Program. The packer/processor may be located within or outside of an area quarantined for ACP.

##### 4. Direct Route

Take the most *continuous, direct route, without interruption* to the approved packer/processor.

##### 5. Evidence of Compliance

Place a copy of the Compliance Agreement and this Exhibit in EACH vehicle transporting mandarins with attached stems and leaves.

##### 6. Records

Maintain shipping records for a minimum of two years and provide such records to the ACP Program upon request.

##### 7. Training

Ensure all employees receive training to be compliant with all specifications of this Compliance Agreement Exhibit.

**8. Spill Notification**

Notify the ACP Program as soon as possible and no later than 24 hours after spillage of any shipment.

**9. Vehicle Tracking System**

List all truck and trailer license plates below. Update the ACP Program immediately any time license plates are added, change, or are no longer in use. If more space is needed, continue on the back of this exhibit or attach pages as necessary.
